Standards Committee

The council passed the following resolution:

"That this Council supports the continuation of the Joint Standards Committee for Warwick District Council and the proposals for representation of the Parish/Town Councils, that there should be four representatives one representing Warwick Rural East Community Forum area, one representing Warwick Rural West Community Forum Area and two representing the areas covered by the four towns.

The Joint Standards Committee will be responsible for undertaking hearings into the Conduct of Councillors following a report to them by the Monitoring Officer. As set out in the Arrangements for Dealing with Complaints about Councillors cases will be determined by Hearing Panels appointed by the Monitoring Officer, in consultation with the Chairman of the Standards Committee. If necessary, the Committee will also be entitled to issue appropriate sanctions against those Councillors involved."

Police Matters & WRW Community Forum Matters

The next forum will take place on 19th May 2016 at Shirehall.

Playgrounds

Inspection report - the April report had been received and there were no issues for immediate consideration

Review of playground inspections – this was postponed until other items on the agenda had been discussed and the council resolved to hold discussions in private. The council resolved to end its arrangement with the current inspector and to appoint Martin Davies as its new playground inspector, with immediate effect.

Matters Arising

TPO 508 at 7 Seymour Close has been approved. Residents and councilors are to be encouraged to bring to the attention of the parish council any trees that might merit a Tree Preservation Order (TPO), particularly in the area of the proposed developments. Cllr Treacy to write an item for the newsletter on this.

HM50 celebrations – it was noted that the chairman had approved expenditure of £50 on a redrawing of the council logo, which will be used on commemorative mugs.

Severn Trent - Cllr Frank Roper to contact Severn Trent informally about actions from the meeting in early April, as they had agreed to keep the council informed of progress on contacting householders and investigating the problems reported. If this does not get a result, the clerk will contact Severn Trent formally to request information.

Correspondence

Changes to the No 68 bus service from 4th June – this will change from a half-hourly to an hourly service. The clerk to write to the bus company to complain about the changes and raise concerns that it will make rural residents more isolated. A copy is to be sent to Chiltern Railways. Information to be added to the website and noted in the newsletter.

Parish Maintenance

Tree at Ryder Close overhanging the pavement – Forestry have been informed but will not treat as a priority. The chairman will arrange for the tree to be cut back so that the footpath is passable.

Pavement at HOTH recommended for resurfacing from A4189 and Old Budbrooke Road from Old School lane to the speed change.

Holes in the road surface at Arras Boulevard – these have been reported and some have been filled.

Woodway – holes at the side of the road in areas where it isn't surfaced but is driven on. The clerk to report to Highways, to be filled with topsoil.

Bin outside the shops on Slade Hill – the bin was removed as it was damaged and WDC has been asked if it will be replaced. The clerk to follow up with WDC.

Matters Pertaining to Outside Bodies

Community Centre – The quiz night organized by the Hampton Magna 50 group was a great success and there is a family disco planned for 11th June as part of the ongoing celebrations.

Parish Council Meeting with Severn Trent Water

On 5th April Councillors Frank and Carol Roper and Councillor David Bryan met with two representatives of Severn Trent Water (STW).

Sewerage Problems

A brief history of the sewerage problems was discussed and a list of the parish council survey responses was shown to STW. A hard copy of the Sewerage Map of the Parish was provided by STW and the problems identified in the survey were discussed. They show a widespread defective sewerage system for many years which was acknowledged by STW.

Councillors asked what action STW would take to remedy the problems. Councillor Frank Roper stressed the need to investigate and remedy soon.

Inspections for the individual properties are now being raised. Visits started in mid-April and will continue for the next few weeks. The STW scheduling team will be contacting these residents provided from the survey returns to arrange and agree dates for access in advance, if they have not already done so. Follow up visits are being arranged as necessary.

Once all of the investigations of the sewers in question have been completed, STW will update BPC on their next steps for each site provided. Not all of these past incidents may be the responsibility of STW but they will confirm with the customer whilst on site. Where cleansing or repair works are required to prevent further sewer blockages or flooding which is a concern for the residents, STW will have those works raised post visit as long as they meet their standard criteria.

STW explained that the Stanks Farm sewage treatment plant was no longer in operation and that the sewage treatment plant at Longbridge dealt with all sewage treatment for Hampton Magna and Hampton on the Hill together with Warwick and Leamington.



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Water Problems

Councillors discussed the recent bursts in the mains water supply. STW is undertaking investigations to understand pressure fluctuations to see if these are contributing to water bursts. STW stated that third party contractors had been responsible for damaging some of the pipes and they were now being charged for this in an effort to stop their occurrence.

Councillor Bryan raised the issue of problems with water quality. STW would investigate water quality concerns at end legs. Samples to be taken to determine water quality. Next steps on return of these sample tests.

STW would also verify asset investment strategy.

The parish council would like to thank residents who responded to its request for information about problems with the sewers.

The parish council would like to thank Andy Thomas, Sue Shirley and Louisa Graham for their interesting and entertaining talks on “Budbrooke Through the Years” at the Annual Parish Meeting in April.
Thank you also to those who attended and contributed to the meeting.

Changes to the Stagecoach Route 68 serving Budbrooke Parish

You may have seen in the local papers that the Stagecoach Route 68 will only be serving Hampton Magna, Hampton on the Hill and the Birmingham Road once an hour from the 4th June. The full timetables can be found on the Parish Council Website and at bus stops from that date, but in essence the buses that pass Hampton Magna stops at 43 minutes past the hour going to Cubbington and the ones at 24 minutes past the hour going to Hatton Park have been **retained**. There is a peculiarity in the weekday morning service, when a G1 service is rerouted from Hatton Park on the 68 route and then continues from Warwick on the G1 route (7.28 at the shops). There is also a Fridays only late night service G1 that extends to Hatton Park, but only if anyone is on it at Warwick. (Fridays only 22.58 Leamington Church, 23.25 Warwick). Full details in the timetables and the website also has a condensed timetable concentrating on the services covering the Parish and the biggest destinations.

At the same time as Stagecoach and the County Council are cutting the services, the County are also discontinuing the taxi tokens scheme designed to compensate those areas affected by poor bus services.
