Warwickshire's new Living Well with Dementia website

Warwickshire County Council has launched a brand new website <u>warwickshire.gov.uk/dementia</u> to support people living with Dementia in Warwickshire.

The website is designed for people with dementia, their carers, family and friends as well as practitioners supporting people with dementia and organisations who would like to know more about becoming dementia friendly.

The new website is easier to navigate and includes a new support and services map to enable people to search for dementia services in their local area. Warwickshire County Council's Public Health and Strategic Commissioning and Communications team have developed the website based on local consultation and best practice guidance.

Cllr Les Caborn, Warwickshire County Council's Portfolio Holder for Health, said: "The new website is a positive step in improving help and support for people living with Dementia in Warwickshire. The new map enables people to find local services and support to help them to live well with dementia. Warwickshire County Council and partner organisations have been instrumental in raising awareness of services available to support people to live well with dementia."

Cllr Alan Webb, Warwickshire County Council's Chair of the Adults, Social Care and Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee added: "We are keen to do more to create a more Dementia Friendly Warwickshire and would encourage individuals and organisations to visit the dementia website to find out more about how they can become more dementia friendly."

An Alzheimer's Society report found that almost half of people interviewed thought that dementia-friendly areas would be nicer places for everyone to live and so creating dementia friendly communities across Warwickshire has the potential to be positive for many people living in Warwickshire.

The website was launched as part of Warwickshire's refreshed <u>Living Well with Dementia Strategy</u> (2016-2019).

Public Comments

Five members of the public were present.

Questions were raised about the parking restriction planned for Blandford Way; WCC Cllr Caborn is to find out when the restriction will be introduced.

Trees behind Gould Road/Arras Blvd were suggested for preservation orders (TPO). The parish council will nominate the trees for TPOs if details, location and reasons for preservation are forwarded to the clerk.

Declarations of Interest and Dispensations

None received.

Apologies and Acceptance of Reasons for Absence

Received and accepted from Cllr D. Shirley.

Minutes of Last Meeting

The council resolved to accept the minutes of the meeting held on 11th January 2017.

Police Matters & WRW Community Forum Matters

The chairman gave feedback from the forum on 26th January, which was the last in the current format. The Neighbourhood Plan Group will look into Extra Care Housing, which was discussed at the forum, and it was

suggested that the Community Safety Team be invited to speak on cyber crime to the council or the annual parish meeting, following its presentation at the forum.

BCA was awarded a grant of £875.36 for new tables for the community centre.

Playgrounds

The January inspection report had been circulated to councillors. There were no matters of concern to be addressed.

Quotes for work at Styles Close – it was agreed that the clerk would request new quotes, to include additional work required.

Matters Arising

Standing order 18f – the council resolved to remove this clause from its standing orders following WALC advice.

Hampton on the Hill phone box – a contract for the adoption of the phone kiosk has been received. The clerk will go through the contract in detail before signing. £1 is payable to BT Payphones in order to transfer ownership to the parish council.

Fields in Trust – Montgomery Avenue play area has been nominated as a "Centenary Field", to be held in trust as a public open space. The chairman and vice-chairman met with a representative of Fields in Trust on 31st January and it was confirmed that the site is suitable. A deed of dedication will be produced and a plaque will be provided, to be displayed at the site. The council will be expected to provide information boards or similar. The clerk to follow up on the cutting back of brambles behind the bungalows at the site.

Correspondence

The following consultations were discussed and responses agreed:

Warwickshire Minerals Plan 2017-2032 – the council has no particular concerns about the plan, other than the transport issues which will have a knock-on effect on the parish with additional traffic on roads in the area, in particular on the A46, and increased road noise.

WDC Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) – the council suggests that the parish should be in Band D and the A46 should be used as the



Help Hampton Magna purchase a community Defibrillator for YOU to use in a lifesaving moment.

My name is Andy Allsopp, a Paramedic Officer for West Midlands Ambulance Service who lives in Hampton Magna. I am writing to show the importance of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). I'm sure you've all heard of them as many communities and work places have acquired them and have trained personnel in the use of the device. Currently Hampton Magna doesn't have one. Which in a case where someone from the village or surrounding area was found in cardiac arrest, there would be a wait for an Ambulance until defibrillation could be performed.

There is around a 5% chance of survival in an out of hospital cardiac arrest with just CPR (chest compressions) alone. However, an out of hospital cardiac arrest with CPR and an AED makes it around a 50% chance that the heart can be re-started.

I'm planning to fund raise to get the village an AED and external heated cabinet to be available to ANYONE in the village or surrounding area who requires its life saving use. The cabinet will be placed on an external wall at the community centre with a code which can be gained by calling 999.

My fundraising idea is to take an aerial photograph of Hampton Magna in celebration of 50 years and sell them for £5 each. I will also be available to take personal aerial photos of your property, starting from 6x4 photo @ £25 each. 7x5 photo @ £28 each. 8x6 photo @ £30 each.

Orders can be placed for the Budbrooke area at hamptonmagnaAED@gmail.com. Please state your name, house number, road name and colour of front door. Money can be paid to any of the Bubrooke community centre team or via paypal or debit/credit card at www.justgiving.com/crowdfunding/hamptonmagnaAED. It is extremely important you state in the email that you have paid via this route and even more important that you provide the information required above so that the photo shot can be arranged. However, if you do not want a photo and wish to contribute to the AED purchase, you can do so at the same website.

Hopefully we can raise more than the £1200 required to provide the village and surrounding area with the lifesaving equipment and cabinet. I know that if my Wife or Son were to have an out of hospital spontaneous cardiac arrest, I would want an AED available to give them the 50% chance of survival. Wouldn't you? Thank you.
