This may be difficult as few of the families are around here anymore, but without asking I cannot succeed.

I am trying to trace all the men who appear on the Roll of Honour. There are 59 names on it and another 15 who were considered but not put on (I have some thoughts but no proof as to why not). I am also trying to trace them.

The other names are John Steane, Ralph Hammond, Albert John Aris, David John Wykes, Henry Jeffs, James Jeffs, Arthur Wainde, Frederick Bourton, Richard Carter, Walter Carter and William Walford.

In addition Percy Woodford, Percy Wainde, Albert Mouzer and Alexander Barnet were not on the memorial and were killed, so missing from the memorial in the church as well.

I have mentioned a few of them men in the past, on the Budbrooke Facebook page. but those who survived can, ironically, be harder to research I hope to do some sort of presentation/exhibition in time to commemorate the end of the First World War(possibly similar to the one I researched for to commemorate the start of the War that was held in the church in August 2014).

This will entail a lot of work and I am specially looking for details of their

lives- family, jobs and especially any photos. War service details would also be very helpful, as for many I only have the scant details on the plaque.
