

AGM REPORT OCT 2018

Hi everyone and welcome to the community centre agm



Well what a year it has been I cannot believe that this time last year we were all

sitting here celebrating the completion of the storage area and 12 months on we have managed to complete the new kitchen, entrance, new roof, new ceiling, lighting and new doors into the main hall, and with the hall being decorated in the Xmass break Phase 4 will be complete.

NONE of this would of been possible without the support of funding from WDC RUCIS, WREN and the parish council. But mainly from the hard work and dedication of the committee who have worked so hard with fundraising events to enable us to top up the funding bids with our own raised funds. The refurbishment of the community centre is still ongoing and we have a list ready for Phase 5 which includes refurbishment of the coffee bar, toilets, outside fencing, canopy and finally rendering of the building but were hopeful as a committee that we can achieve this. When we set about as a committee with our 5 year plan it seemed such a big ask but I am so pleased with what has been achieved so far. The help of the contractors GCG, Retain and Holl and Holl have been invaluable with what we have achieved over the last 12 months.

We have tried as a committee to vary the events we hold to enable different ages to attend. The popular events have been the Quiz, Bingo and the annual scarecrow event which this year we decided to include the launch of the community centre. It was so lovely to see so many people attend and receive such positive comments of what we had changed to the centre. Meeting some of the original committee who instigated the building of this centre was so lovely. After the launch I received a message from the granddaughter of Allan Golding saying "She had heard that the community centre looked fab and how lovely it was that her granddad had a mention" its small things like this that makes all the sleepless nights worthwhile



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
