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'Pop-up' Foodbank and Make Lunch

A 'pop-up' food bank, based at The Open Door, has facilitated occasional emergency supplies to those who have food insecurity whether through access or financial hardship. This has complemented our 'shopping support team' who have offered regular help to the isolated with no other access to help.

St Michael's holiday hunger work via the Make Lunch project has seen individual meals delivered to up to 50 households each week, with 128 children benefitting. Over the course of the pandemic demand has increased and by the end of the 2020 school summer holidays close to 10,000 individual meals will have been provided to local families in receipt of free school meals.

We have capacity to help more families - if <u>you're</u> in receipt of free school meals, or know someone in need, please contact St Michael's Church Office on 01926 407020 (all requests will be treated in confidence).

Whilst we have moved on from the initial 'crisis mode', it is apparent that there is a second wave of need emerging. The group will continue to review the services it provides to the community and will adapt to provide support as needs arise.

It goes without saying that none of the above would have been possible without the support and generosity of the community and our team of wonderful volunteers.

Community Library

In April the Community Library was launched. Stocked entirely with donations from the community, the library provides locals with a wide range of things to do, read & watch (jigsaws, books and DVDs). The library is run by a pair of local A-level students who have taken on responsibility for establishing processes to 'quarantine' all donations received for at least 72 hours, documenting all items, promoting what is available and distributing items in a way that is compliant with the strict safety protocols that we have established. Items available are shared each week on the village Facebook groups and requested items delivered on Saturday mornings. In time, we would like to welcome visitors to the library so that those who don't have access to social media can safely visit and select items to borrow.

Prescription Deliveries

A key strand of the project has been to support Budbrooke Medical Centre, A team of 12 volunteers have delivered several thousand prescriptions and travelled over 5000 miles between them. We also have volunteers who can collect and deliver prescriptions to vulnerable residents who are registered at other medical centres.

Family Support Network (Budbrooke Buddies)

Budbrooke Buddies organized a number of activities within the village including teddy bear hunts and activity challenges which saw children draw activities such as hopscotch, or instructions such as 'do 10 star jumps' on the pavement outside their house. Hampton Magna Virtual Zoo was a great community event with animals ranging from monkeys and meerkats to snakes and lizards making an appearance.

Supporting the community during the Coronavirus pandemic

Since launching in early March, volunteers from Budbrooke Parish's COVID-19 Support project have covered more than 5000 miles and dedicated over 4000 hours to serve the local community.

Building on its place at the heart of Hampton Magna and faced with being unable to operate as a café during the pandemic, the Open Door became the hub for a wide variety of community support activities. Over £12,000 has been raised from donations, grants and local fundraising events to help bring food, resources, and items such as hand sanitiser and face masks to the vulnerable.

Community Helpline

Since its launch in mid-March, the helpline has been manned by a team of local volunteers every day of the week for 12 hours a day (between 8am and 8pm), At its peak it received over 20 calls a day. The helpline is the first port of call for requests for help and support from members of the local community and we have received funding to continue operating the helpline until the end of the year.

A Listening Ear

This key strand of our project offers emotional support to those who are isolated and would simply like someone to talk to. This is done by making phone calls and providing connection to those who are isolated and feeling lonely. All volunteers have existing DBS checks and have been provided with online safeguarding training through St Michael's Church.

Flu Vaccinations Further information

- Please do not bring in a handbag/bag etc. into the clinic
- Please wear a face covering at all times (over the nose and mouth)
- Please wear a short sleeved top
- Partners/Carers can come together
- Two stations will be running at the same time, a separate exit door will be provided from the entrance
- Please take the opportunity to go to the toilet before arriving rather than during your visit (if possible)
- There will be a hand sanitising station
- Staff members will be wearing full PPE
- Social distancing will be observed at all times
- There will be local volunteers present helping direct people where they need to go etc.
- There will be community support workers available
- We have allocated Covid Support Packs to those with certain medical conditions and will be distributing them during the clinics
- If you are eligible for a pneumococcal vaccination please do book for it to be done at the same time
- If you have previously experienced an allergy or have a phobia please call to book outside of these clinic times
- For those with limited transport/mobility please do book an appointment at the surgery rather than at the Church
- Children's vaccine: Please email the nursing team at enquiries@budbrookemc.nhs.uk so we can order a vaccine for your child (if they usually receive one)
