Rewinding project: letter received (as mentioned in correspondence) Clerk to ask resident to be involved - Cllr Treacy to liaise with the resident who wrote the letter & report back. Cllr Caborn will provide information on locations etc.

Parish Tree project: 2 trees planted today at Styles Close - Chairman to ascertain what the PC responsibilities are. PC representative to attend photo shoot on Fri 4.12.20 - Cllr Daffern will attend.

Proposal for new village facility - Field Kitchen - details received circulated to the PC. Agreed PC need to know more about how it would work and daily expectations - ME reported the idea would be more of a



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'community' event, PC asked who will be responsible for the building and who will run it & details of associated costs etc. PC don't have allotments at present but will revisit at that time.

Finance: CC request for £5000 committed funding for redevelopment work previously approved & contribution to Parish Noticeboard was approved for half of the total cost approx £1000. PC to manage the purchase and invoicing. Cllr Hales suggested PC consider alternative more cost effective options. Cllr Treacy will forward links.

Surgery Newsletter-January 2021

Covid vaccine programme is now firmly underway. Recalls are being organised in groups of different patient types. All over 80's should have been contacted to arrange their appointments. If you haven't been contacted as of yet please contact the surgery to discuss with a team member. Health care professionals are also being asked to receive their vaccinations. If you are a patient and a health care professional in a health or social care setting, face to face with patient, please contact the practice and we have a process in place to organise a vaccination for you. Main contact is Alicia Erskine.

It has just been announced that all over 70's are to next be recalled and this will be underway shortly. Please await contact from the South Warwickshire GP Federation call centre to arrange an appointment with you for the Studley Hub. The Covid vaccination is being dealt with centrally rather than at individual surgery level due to the need to roll out the programme as quickly as possible. This is NOT a practice decision, it is due to the need to mobilise the vaccination programme quickly and to take into consideration the logistics needed to transport and deliver a delicate vaccine (the Pfizer one needs to be transported at extremely low temperatures) to our most vulnerable populations. It was decided groups of GP's (Primary Care Networks) were required to deliver the vaccines at hub sites. Whilst a Budbrooke location was put forward by the surgery, on evaluation by the PCN clinical director, the Studley hub best fitted the requirements for the vaccine delivery.

We are aware that it may cause concern to those who do not have their own transport to get to Studley for their vaccination as there is no public transport. In situations such as this:

- 1) In the first instance please ask within your family/carer bubble and if this is not possible please
- 2) Ask amongst your local volunteer provision e.g. Covid Support or Mutual Aid group
- 3) Contact Voluntary Transport Provider VASA (01789 262889). Please note that there is a cost to this option of approximately 45p per mile

If you are unable to access any of the above please contact the call centre on 0800 4081447 and they will be able to help you.

Vaccination scams

Please be aware that with the introduction of the vaccination, there are individuals willing to take advantage targeting the most vulnerable and at risk in our society. The NHS vaccination is free and cannot be purchased privately in the UK. The NHS will NEVER ask for money or bank details, they will not turn up on your door step without pre-arrangement to administer the vaccination and will not ask you to confirm your identity by sending personal documents such as copies of passports etc.

Birmingham Millennium Point Mass Vaccination Centre

As we are within a 45 mile radius of the mass vaccination centre in Birmingham, those eligible will be contacted by NHS

England by letter to arrange an appointment to access the vaccination centre in Birmingham. If you wish to get your vaccination there please arrange to receive it in Birmingham following the instructions in the letter received. If you would prefer to get the vaccine locally at Studley (as detailed above) please wait for the South Warwickshire GP Federation Contact Centre to call you to arrange an appointment locally. Please do not arrange an appointment at one and turn up at the other as there won't be sufficient vaccine doses available. Appointments are booked according to the supply available.

Flu vaccine for those eligible over under 65's.

If you have not yet had this year's seasonal flu vaccination please contact Budbrooke Reception to arrange an appointment. Flu can cause hospital admissions and visits to medical facilities, which carries a risk for Covid. Please have a vaccine to protect against seasonal flu. We have a small supply left and feel this is a real positive this year for it to be offered to so many people.

You will be eligible if you are 50-65 years old, are 18 years - 65 years old and have an underlying health condition such as asthma or diabetes, you are living with (in a support bubble or spend time with) with someone classed as extremely clinically vulnerable, are a carer, have any caring duties including doing shopping for a neighbour, work in health and social care.

Extended hours change

During the recent lockdown the additional workload has meant we have altered our extended hour's day. We have altered this until further notice to a Tuesday (previously Mondays). All appointments will be telephone based and will be available until 8pm.

Clinical trials

We are currently undertaking clinical trials in the surgery. If you are 50+ with underlying health conditions such as diabetes or 65+ years and have Covid-like symptoms such as the main symptoms of temperature, new cough or loss of sense of taste and smell or others such as cold, headache, aching muscles, stomach upset or have recently tested positive please do let us know. We can enter you into a trial whereby they are testing existing treatments that have been used for a long time for other conditions to see if they have an impact on the severity of Covid symptoms and the ability to reduce the numbers of hospitalisations.

Covid swab tests

We are a part of clinical research whereby we can supply Covid swab kits to either pick up from the surgery or to be delivered directly to your door to complete at home. The results will then be sent via text message. If you do develop Covid-like symptoms then please do not hesitate to contact us to get a hold of a kit.
