Public Participation (strictly limited to 5 minutes): 4 members of the public attended. Clerk to arrange a link to the recent newsletter on PC website. Clarification was requested regarding CIL monies. Chairman explained there will be future discussions.

Apologies & Declarations Of Interest & Dispensations: non received.

Approve February meeting minutes: approved a true and accurate record.

Planning: Noted permission granted for W20/1331- Land adj Daly Av - Display of 12no. flag poles and flags and 1no. free standing, V-board sign & for W20/1825 19 Gould Road extension.

Noted permission refused for W20/1608 - Cotswold, B'ham Road - single storey rear extension, first floor side extension and conversion of study into garage & permission also refused as planning permission is required for W21/0157AG - Land at Holes Wood, Woodway Lane - Notification for prior approval for erection of a new forestry building.

PC considered W20/2133 Land off Daly Avenue planning application and agreed objection.

PC received W20/2008 Three Jays, Hampton Road - Single storey extension: & will decide via email.

PC noted Highways objection to W20/1825.

PC noted Chairman's report from Planners meeting 11.2.21. A new email address has been set up for any queries relating to the developments to send to. Chairman will review the email box prior to the meeting on 11th March & discuss items raised along with street cleaners who should not be parking and leaving engines running.

PC approved proposals for repeat traffic survey HOTH - £465 plus VAT from 1st March for a week period to provide a comparison to traffic flow pre-development work. Chairman queried should the survey in HM also be repeated to provide comparisons. Agreed to repeat just after Easter, Chairman to identify road locations and Clerk to confirm costs associated and circulate.

BPC Planning working document: Chairman had looked at NP and recent projects with a view to identifying for use of CIL funds. He has produced a document to form a plan. Chairman to circulate to PC for consideration prior to producing a formal plan.

Correspondence: : WDC People's Inquiry into Climate Change, launch of recommendations received. Various planning development items sent to inbox.

Parish Maintenance/Playgrounds: Rewilding Project - flower budget approved at £360 Parish Dog Waste bins - defer. PC received playground inspection reports.

Recent road resurface between HOTH & HM has started to sink again. Also along Slade Hill, Arras Boulevard & Gould Road there are worsening potholes. Chairman to raise at next meeting.

Budbrooke Medical Centre - Research

PCR swabbing

If you have flu-like/Covid-like symptoms please do collect a PCR testing kit from us to test for infectious diseases. It is a single nose and throat swab just like the Covid ones but these are tested for a number of different infectious diseases including Covid-19, seasonal flu and RSV (which can cause bronchiolitis). If you are worried about turnaround times for results please do book a test via a drive thru/walk-in centre as normal but also pick up a kit from us and do this as well (in the name of research!). This will significantly help researchers understand what infectious diseases are circulating in the population as there is more than just Covid out there. During weekends kits can be obtained from the Budbrooke Covid Helpline or during surgery hours from us directly at Budbrooke Medical Centre. Once you have completed the swab you simply put the prepaid postage box in the post and we will be sent your results.

Covid - 19 research

If you do return a positive Covid result please do consider entering into a clinical study. We are a research centre for a national study looking to evaluate medications to see if they prevent hospitalisations versus usual care. Currently an anti-inflammatory drug that is usually prescribed to treat gout is being investigated. If you are aged 65 or aged 18 + with underlying health conditions please call us. We can walk you through what is required and enrol you into the study if you wish (there is no obligation if you do not wish to proceed). The Fouling of Land by Dogs (Warwick District Council) Order 2011 requires owners to remove faeces deposited by their dog from any land to which the public have access in Warwick district and which is open to the air (including land which is covered but open to the air on at least one side). Persons contravening the Order may be prosecuted through the courts [maximum fine £1000] or given a fixed penalty charge.
