Public Participation - 15 minutes: Dropped kerb project - Clerk to to obtain an update from County Highways, this was WCC Cllr Caborns project which was for a total of 10 last year and this.

Issues with overhanging branches generally discussed. Open door refurbishment is progressing well, open days will be planned later this month. Security monitors at BCC, it doesn't need planning permission but to make PC aware.

A resident attended to make the PC aware of a personal issue that has affected her family.

Apologies & Declarations Of Interest & Dispensations: Apologies from Cllrs D Shirley & R Daffern.

No declarations of interest or dispensations.

Approve August meeting minutes: Approved a true and accurate record. Chairman signed the Minutes.

Matters Arising

Jubilee Tree on the Village Green HOTH update - Cllr Bryan will forward

details to the Clerk to then instruct what the resident needs to do. PC will then take responsibility for the Mulberry tree.

Clerk Vacancy - PC to extend the advert closing date to encourage more responses. All applications received so far will be held until after the closing date.

Planning:

To discuss / agree repeat of traffic survey - PC agreed there would be little point at this stage, there would be very little action the PC could take.

Proposed upgrade to existing radio base station installation at ctil 11363323 - ref 410, land at little chef, m&s store / petrol station, a46 south bound: PC noted.

PC considered:

W20/2173 - 13 Damson Road - Retrospective planning permission for the proposed two-storey rear extension, internal alterations, replacement windows & new front bay window with canopy roof: .PC has no objections.

W21/1261 - 2 Field Barn Road - Porch Extension: PC has no objections.

W21/0898 - 7 Curlieu Close - Proposed application of render to front fascia and partial side elevations of dwelling: PC has no objections.

Noted permission granted: W21/0717 - 42 Old BB Road - first floor rear and side extension and alterations to the existing conservatory

Chairman reported that the last meeting with Developers was cancelled due to holidays and lack of any new issues to take forward. The issue re. Lloyd Close, Chairman contacted and requested they revisit the access and signage - signage to include cul-de-sac or no development access etc.

BPC Planning working document / CIL Funds proposals: FB response to CIL received, Chairman thanked Cllr R Treacy-Hales, results were discussed and will be amalgamated into the questionnaire findings for consideration at the next stage.

Suggested a sub-group be formed to discuss the findings. Chairman will collate and share before it is published.

Correspondence:

Request for Grit Bin at top of Old School Lane: PC agreed, Clerk to purchase for the location.

Cllr Thomas requested whether a warning sign can be placed on Old Budbrooke Road to say 'no footpath' / pedestrian on roadside. Also for National Highways to put warning signs on A46 in both directions as there are 3 public footpaths crossing the A46.

PC understands the piece of land at the corner of Damson Road & Dorchester with the Silver Birch is unregistered and Clerk requested to make enquiries about registering it and fees etc.

Parish Maintenance/Playgrounds:

Request for standpipe at the Barrack Wall: Cllr M Treacy-Hales has sought to obtain costs, these will be bought to the PC for consideration once prices are confirmed. Water costs also to be considered. Established areas are 'wild' but do require regular watering whilst becoming established. Chairman to ask Developers about redigging the land and to replant as currently raised beds.

Land encroachment: discussed earlier in the meeting.

Cul de sac street signs: discussed above.

Two missing black and white safety poles are down along Old BB Road by brook

Sunken pothole along Old BB Road where bends to right just before Mont Av on rh side of road

Marten Close & AB, recording extent of dips on the roads

Dropped kerb opposite Clinton Av on Arras Boulevard where there are 6 slabs set into the tarmac the slabs are lower than the surrounding tarmac, this is a trip hazard & needs lifting and laid level.

The Fouling of Land by Dogs (Warwick District Council) Order 2011 requires owners to remove faeces deposited by their dog from any land to which the public have access in Warwick district and which is open to the air (including land which is covered but open to the air on at least one side). Persons contravening the Order may be prosecuted through the courts [maximum fine £1000] or given a fixed penalty charge.

Reminder

It is your responsibility to cut back and maintain overhanging hedges from your property onto public footpaths and highways, many are causing difficulty for pedestrians, wheelchair users and prams.
