Chairman requested Item 8, Tree planting, The Heart of England Forest be moved to Public Participation. Amy Bambridge provided details on what The Heart of England Forest Charity can offer the Parish Council.

There is a 3 year partnership between Warwick Council and The Heart of England Forest to plant 160,000 trees by 2030. Amy has identified Montgomery Avenue Park as a potential place to plant the trees with some being used as hedging. Budbrooke Parish Council will be allowed to have 420 free trees and a local project to be set up to plant them. Scheme approved but details to be discussed further with Maggie Treacy-Hales and Clerk

## Parking issues

With the increase of staycations more UK attractions are seeing an increase in traffic, as a result some councils and police have asked the government to revamp the parking fines from the current £70 lowering to £50 if paid quickly to £150 lowering to £100.

Many councils in the UK are also raising parking charges to offset the increased spending brought about by the cost of living, With fines potentially increasing and charges going up its more important than ever to know the rules and restrictions.

The Highway Code lists several places you can't park and parking in these areas could result in a fine.

1. On a bend. (this is considered endangering other road users)
2. Opposite or within 10 meters of any junction unless in an authorised and marked parking space.
3. In front of a curb lowered for people with disabilities. (there have been a few added around the village)
4. Near the brow of a hill or on a bridge.
5. Yellow lines. (some instances it's allowed such as blue badge users)
6. Anywhere that might prevent access for emergency services.
7. Opposite another parked vehicle if this would cause an obstruction or opposite a traffic island.
8. Near a school entrance. (most have warnings marked on the road)
9. On a pedestrian crossing.
10. On a cycle track.
11. On the approach to a level crossing.
12. In a taxi bay.
13. In front of an entrance to property.

## Recipe page

This month is a simple Scone recipe, scones can be both sweet with  
the addition of jam and cream or mix it up with bacon, cheese,  
herbs or anything, just add to the basic dry mix.



500g Self Raising Flour  
80g Unsalted Butter cubed  
40g Caster sugar  
5g Baking Powder  
200ml Warm water  
1 Egg for beating

Mix the sugar and flour in a bowl, add the cubed butter and work  
through until the consistency of fine breadcrumbs.

Preheat oven to 180deg C, use extra butter to grease baking  
pans.

Slowly add the water, combine gently using hands or a spatula. It is  
important that you mix as little as possible and stop mixing once you have a  
cohesive dough. (the idea is reduce the amount of Gluten that forms, more  
Gluten produces a heavy scone)

Add any extra flavourings like grated cheese, or keep plain.

Lightly flour a worktop and flatten the dough, keep it quite thick (4cm or 2")  
then using a 2" floured cutter, cut out scones, place on a baking tray (keeping  
room for the dough to rise), reform dough and repeat until all dough is used.

Brush scones with beaten egg.

Bake for approx 20 minutes, the scones should be light  
golden brown. Allow to cool slightly on a wire rack, best  
served warm with butter.
